

- certainly sir という表現は of course を丁寧にした言い方です。女性患者の場合陂 sirではなくて、madamを遣って下さい。
- 2. 普通にものを頼むときには For me を後につけます。これはよい関係を築き、あるいは会話者どうしを結び つけるのに役立ちます。
- 3. I'm afraid という表現は悪い知らせが次にくることが多いです。例をあげると、I'm afraid you'll have to have an operation. (手術をする必要があるでしょう)などです。
- 4. Would you like me to (+ 原形不定詞)は何かを申し出るときに役に立つ表現です。例えば、Would you like me to talk to your mother? (お母さんに私から話しましょうか?)などです。
- 5. Just は和らげる言葉で、話し手の威圧感を軽減します。例えば、I just need to check your blood pressure. (ちょっと血圧を測らせてください)または I'm just going to take a look at your chest. (ちょっと胸を診察しますね)などです。
